INSIDERS' GUIDE

CHARLOTTE DE TONNAC AND HUGO SAUZAY, DESIGNERS

Charlotte de Tonnac and Hugo Sauzay of Festen Architecture live and work out of their Haussmannian-style Haut-Marais flat, a spot they enjoy for its Parisian authenticity and central location. It's also within walking distance of some of their favourite stores, like [Ofr](#) bookshop (see p080), where they pick up photography titles and rare editions, and menswear boutique [Éditions MR](#) (10 boulevard des Filles du Calvaire, 11^e, T 48 04 06 08): 'The coats are perfectly cut in a classic French style,' says Sauzay. They will often stroll to [Bob's Kitchen](#) (74 rue de Gravilliers, 3^e, T 52 55 11 66) for a simple lunch, perhaps brown rice with roasted vegetables, lemon confit and basil. When they have the time, they rise early and visit the main courtyard at the [Louvre](#) (see p029), best seen at first light. They also like [Le Bal](#) (6 impasse de la Défense, 18^e, T 44 70 75 50), for contemporary visual art, Jakob + Macfarlane's pea-green [Cité de la Mode et du Design](#) (34 quai d'Austerlitz, 13^e, T 76 77 25 30) and [Musée National Gustave Moreau](#) (14 rue de La Rochefoucauld, 9^e, T 48 74 38 50), set in the Symbolist painter's apartment and studio.

They often dine at Japanese bistro [SŌMA](#) (see p032), where the beef tataki and miso spinach ticks the boxes, followed by drinks at [La Buvette](#) (see p048). If late-night dancing is on the cards, they head to the happening hotel bar at [Le Pigalle](#) (see p022), and order a Kir du Pigalle, made with crème de cassis, white wine and Salers. *For full addresses, see Resources.*
